

Suzie & Nadine

We may never know if they share the same parents, but Suzie and Nadine are akin to sisters and have had many of the same experiences in their short lives. They were tied together to a tree when they were found by Love Puerto Rico Goldens. After a short stay with a foster family in Puerto Rico, Suzie and Nadine shared cargo space on their flight to Chicago. They enthusiastically met their AGaG greeters. Volunteers helped the newcomers into their Back Seats and headed to the veterinary intake exams. Suzie and Nadine shared the same diagnosis of worms. Suzie with coccidian and whipworms and Nadine with hookworms. The other diagnosis they had in common was Heartworm and they immediately started their treatment.

Volunteers split the trek of Suzie's transport to meet her foster. Meanwhile, Nadine was introduced to her family at the animal hospital. This Tale of the sisters' slow recovery from Heartworm was just beginning, but not without a detour along the way.

At a petite twenty-seven pounds at



intake, Nadine is a happy girl who loves cuddling on the couch. With her sleek black coat, she is a real eye catcher. She was quick to let fur foster brother Lucky know that she was in charge and wanted foster mom's full attention. After a slow start and eating very little, forty-two pound Suzie soon turned into a piglet dancing with delight at the sight of her filled dinner bowl. She is generous with kisses and likes to stay close to Wendy. As the days passed, Wendy noticed that Suzie's girth was becoming rounder and other body changes were noticeable. It was also noticed that Nadine seemed to be filling out too. After exams by their vets, it was discovered that sisters Suzie and Nadine shared something else in common; they were both pregnant and very close to giving birth. Nadine was moved to a "doggie doula" foster home home for whelping.



On June 19, Suzie delivered six male and four female puppies in a variety of colors. Not to be outdone in this race to motherhood, Nadine delivered four puppies the next day. Sadly, only one mighty male puppy named Chesney survived. It soon became evident that Chesney needed siblings to provide warmth from puppy piles and companionship to help him socialize. Mama Nadine would also be more comfortable with a bigger litter to consume her milk supply and help prevent mastitis. At the same time, there was concern that as the pups grow, caring for such a large litter could overtax Suzie's Heartworm compromised heart. So, in the ultimate gesture of sharing with her sister, Suzie gave up three of her babies to Nadine's loving care. Nadine immediately accepted these newborns who had the familiar scent of the sister she had been separated from. Suzie is raising JoJo, Miki, Bella, Chicky, Buster, Jack and Rosa while Nadine is mothering Chesney, Petey, Nina, and Lola. All is copasetic with these combined families of cousins and siblings. After the

puppies are weaned, both mothers will continue their Heartworm treatment and be ready to enjoy healthy Golden lives.
